The commencement of early works marks an exciting milestone in delivering the \$1.2 billion new Bundaberg Hospital.

The new hospital will feature a clinical services building with a rooftop helipad, a mental health unit and a facility support centre. It's the largest health investment the region has ever seen and will deliver an additional 121 overnight beds to serve the region's growing and ageing community.

What are early works?

Early works involve preparing the site for construction of the new hospital buildings.

The new hospital site is located on land between Eggmolesse Street, Kay McDuff Drive and Bundaberg Ring Road, as illustrated overleaf.

The scope of early works includes:

- surveying
- · fencing installation
- · vegetation removal
- · construction site offices and worker facilities
- bulk excavation / earthworks
- piling
- establishing in-ground services.

Construction hours

Early works are scheduled to start in May 2024, weather and construction conditions permitting. Early works construction working hours are 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday. No work will take place outside of these hours or public holidays without prior notice and approvals.

What to expect during early works?

TRAFFIC

Early works will see an increase in vehicle movements in and around the site, which may result in short travel delays. At times, oversize vehicles will deliver heavy machinery such as excavators, dozers, dump trucks and piling rigs. Construction vehicles will access the site using the service road at the Eggmolesse Street and Johanna Boulevard intersection, as illustrated

overleaf.

Dust emissions will be minimised by:

- using a wheel wash to clean vehicles leaving site to prevent the spread of excavated material
- using water trucks to suppress dust
- covering stockpiled materials as required.

NOISE AND VIBRATION

Due to the nature of the work some localised noise and vibration may occur during the use of heavy machinery. Noise and vibration will be monitored at all times with noise and vibration-limiting construction methodologies adopted.
